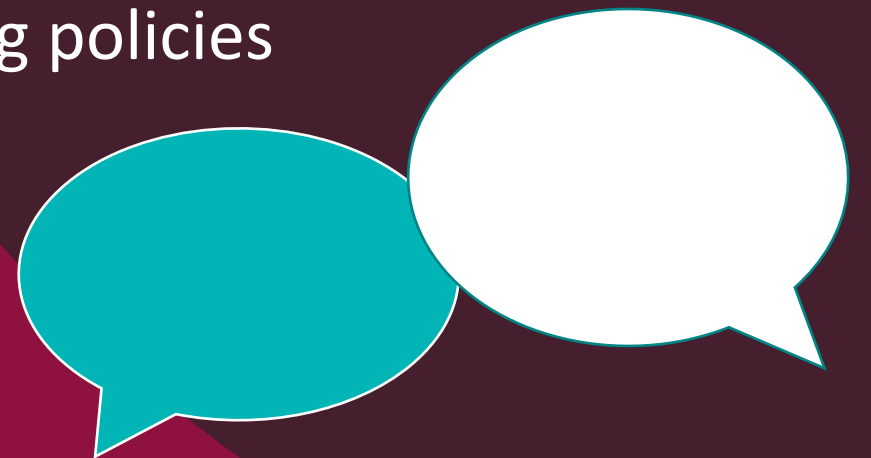

EU Youth Dialogue - What is it?

- A dialogue between young people, youth organisations, policy and decision makers, researchers and other actors.
- Young people interact with decision makers on a local, national and European level.
- Their views are taken into account when making policies for young people.



EU Youth Dialogue - What are the aims?

- Achieve Youth Goals
- Encourage greater youth participation in Europe
- Promote equal participation between young women and men
- Include diverse voices to allow all young people to contribute to policy shaping
- Bring about positive change to youth policy at a local, regional, national and European level
- Strengthen young people's citizenship and sense of belonging to society and European Union

Who is involved?

National Level – National Working Group

- British Youth Council, relevant staff and UK Young Ambassadors
- Department of Digital, Culture, Media and Sport
- British Council (National Agency for the Erasmus+ programme)
- Ad hoc representation from other relevant youth, youth organisations, academics, experts etc.

Who is involved?

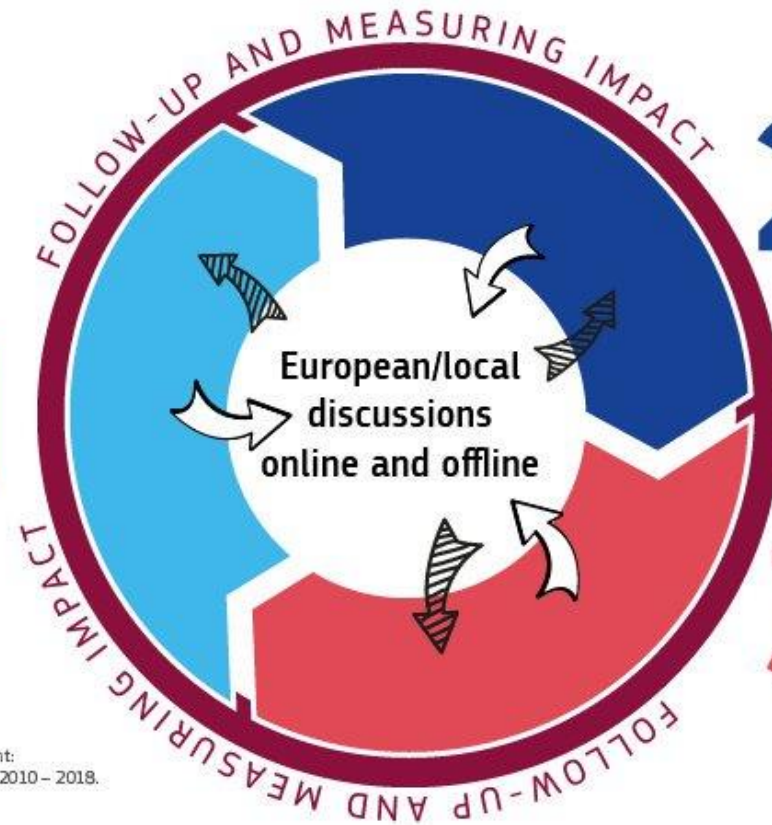
EU Level

Trio of Presidencies

- EU Youth Conference in Finland (1-3 July)
 - Focused on Youth Work
- Collecting and analysing results



Phase 3 – where we are now!

- EU Youth Conference in Croatia (March 2020)
 - Looking at Rural Youth opportunities
