










**Average Minimum Time to Reach a Further Education Institution, Rural and Urban Areas, 2019**

# Hundreds of villages lose their GP surgery as crisis grows across country

Hundreds of villages have lost their GP surgery amid a deepening crisis across the country, an investigation reveals. Experts say rural and coastal areas were being hit particularly hard by a national shortage of family doctors, forcing elderly and vulnerable patients to travel further for their care.

The figures reveal 1,946 villages which are at least three miles from the nearest GP practice -162 more than was the case just two years ago.


Heart attack patients in rural areas will wait nearly 50% longer for an ambulance than those in towns and cities, with those in the worst areas waiting for 15 minutes, new figures reveal.

On average, people in rural areas have to wait 12 minutes and 31 seconds for an ambulance to arrive for the most serious category one call



#### **Net Decline in GP Surgeries, 2013-2024**





15.5% reduction in number of GP Surgeries in Rural Areas


























Number of passenger journeys on local bus services, 2005-2023
